Take Necessary Precautions

Fleeing evil is important. *Abstain from every form of evil* (1 Thess. 5:22). Cleanliness is vital. *If we walk in the light as He is in the light...the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanses us from all sin* (1 John 1:7). Building and strengthening ourselves with consistent Bible study is essential. *Brethren, I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified* (Acts 20:32). After filling ourselves with God's word, we must exercise that knowledge to discern between good and evil (Heb. 5:14). And let us remember the ones who are especially vulnerable, the spiritually weak or those who are young in the faith.

The Ebola virus kills quickly and the seasonal flu claims thousands of lives every year, but may we never forget that sin sickness destroys souls for eternity!
