The Facts of Life

L. L. Brigance was a master of languages, teaching Latin, Greek and English at Freed-Hardeman College. He wrote many of the outlines used by N. B. Hardeman in what is now known as the Hardeman Tabernacle Sermons. Many came to learn the truth because of these lessons. I thought you might enjoy a lesson from a book of his outlines under the title of this article.

Brigance noted life is made up of time. He quoted Benjamin Franklin, who said, "Dost thou love life? Then do not squander time, for that is the stuff life is made of." The Lord's half-brother expressed it this way: "Whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away" (James 4:14). Paul urged the Christians in Ephesus to make good use of time (Ephesians 5:15-17).

Life needs a purpose. Brigance quoted a poem from an unknown author.

Half the wrecks upon life's ocean
If some star had been their guide
Would have safely reached the harbor
But they drifted with the tide.

Paul wrote, "that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting, but, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ" (Ephesians 4:14-15). He kept his focus like an athlete competing to win and made sure he followed God's rules (1 Corinthians 9:25-27).

Life goes beyond the grave. Henry Wadsworth Longfellow penned:

Life is real! Life is ernest! And the grave is not its goal; Dust thou art, to dust returnest, Was not spoken of the soul.

Paul looked forward to death because he would receive a new body (2 Corinthians 5:1). He told the brethren in Rome, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18).

We can see life's value. Let us use our time well, focused on the heavenly goal, our purpose and realizing life does not stop at the grave.
