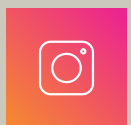

Evangelism from a Youth Minister's Viewpoint

They are also the church of the present, so I encourage you to not make them think otherwise; for we have work to do.

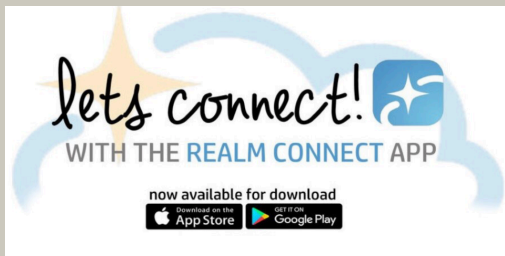
