Jesus told a parable about the kingdom of heaven, in which He described ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom (Matt. 25:1-13). Five of them were wise. They made preparation by taking extra oil with them. Five of them were foolish because they did not. The bridegroom was delayed, so they slept. At midnight a call rang out that the bridegroom was coming. The ten virgins arose and trimmed their lamps, but the foolish virgins' lamps were going out. They asked the wise virgins for oil, but they told them they should go to those who sell oil, else all of them would run out. While they were away buying oil, the bridegroom came. Those who were ready went in with him and the door was shut. The foolish virgins returned and begged that the door be opened, but the bridegroom said, "I do not know you." Jesus concluded the parable saying, "Watch, therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour in which the Son of Man is coming."

The Lord's message is clear. We would all do well to think out of the box.
